

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO **CALVIN MILBURY**

Far too often ideas simply fall through the cracks, but not here in New Brunswick. The New Brunswick Innovation Foundation is bridging the gap between research and enterprise to accelerate innovation so that more ideas go from the lab to the marketplace.

Last year we invested \$12.1 million into New Brunswick entrepreneurs and researchers. For every dollar we invested, an additional \$4.24 was leveraged from other capital sources. That's a \$63.4 million impact! More than capital, we also provide our innovators with access to expertise, knowledge and our network.

For example, our innovation voucher fund partnered 23 New Brunswick companies with researchers who collaborated to develop ideas or solve problems through R&D. By leveraging the specialized expertise and equipment that resides within our research community, we were able to help these companies improve their profitability and competitiveness, resulting in positive economic growth.

For the third consecutive year, NBIF was ranked by the Canadian Venture Capital Association as being among the Top 5 most active venture capital funds in Canada. A record \$4.63 million in venture capital was invested in 29 high-growth potential companies. Our portfolio stands strong at 45 companies and is expected to grow thanks to our most successful Breakthru yet. The competition attracted more than 140 entrepreneurs from across Canada, putting New Brunswick on the map as THE place to launch your startup.



Our year ended on a positive note with the Government of New Brunswick committing \$45.6 million to NBIF. These funds will enable us to help even more innovators throughout our province bring their ideas to reality. With the dedication of our team combined with the resolve of our clients, NBIF and our network are committed more than ever to drive innovation and economic growth in New Brunswick.

INNOVATION VOUCHER FUND

The objective of the Innovation Voucher Fund is to spark innovation inside existing businesses, specifically small-to-medium sized enterprises. SMEs need to be innovative to compete in a global marketplace. NBIF will pair SMEs with New Brunswick Research Institutes to improve or develop new products, processes, or technologies. We will fund 80% of the project cost up to a maximum of \$80,000.

PROJECT RANGE: \$10,000 - \$100,000



La Maison BeauSoleil, a global oyster producer, is taking oyster cleaning to a new level by working with CCNB to create a new, more efficient process. If the project is successful, production and profitability will increase, and the physically demanding task of handwashing oysters will be reduced.

Meakthru

Breakthru 2017 was our most successful competition yet! We received 61 high-quality applications from across the country, and awarded more than \$1 MILLION in cash and in-kind services to 4 new startups. We secured more than 20 partners who brought their expertise to mentor, guide and support our aspiring entrepreneurs.

A COL BUT

For the first time, NBIF opened the competition to applicants across the country. Our goal was to find entrepreneurs looking to start their business in New Brunswick, so we set up a separate National category with a prize pot of over \$250,000. Our National Grand Prize Winner was Newpy, a social media packaging company looking to change the way products are advertised on social media.



Our Grand Prize Winner, Pfera Inc., walked away with more then \$275,000 in cash & in-kind prizes. Lisa Pfister, Founder and CEO, has developed new technology to innovate and manage the equine reproduction process.

Our runners-up, SomaDetect and WEnTech Solutions, both secured over \$175,000 cash and in-kind services. SomaDetect has developed a technology to test somatic cell counts and fat content in cow's milk. WEnTech Solutions is a SaaS company that has developed a cloud-based analysis system for biomass and waste-to-energy conversion solutions.

TALENT DEVELOPMENT FUNDING

NBIF offers Talent Development Funding to New Brunswick Research Institutions in several ways, but primarily through our Start-up Award Funding, and the Research Technician (RTI) and Research Assistantship (RAI) Initiatives.



Start-up Award funding is provided to Research Institutes to recruit new talent from outside of New Brunswick. Since inception, we have helped recruit over 60 researchers to the province.

In the 2016–17 RTI and RAI competitions, we received requests for 24 technicians and 282 assistantships. A total of 118 positions were funded, 6 RTI and 112 RAI.

In partnership with the Department of Post-Secondary Education, Training & Labour, NBIF awarded more than 200 scholarships to graduate students in the province. Scholarships are provided to domestic and international students whose focus is STEM or Social Innovation.

RESEARCH INNOVATION FUND

Funding under the Research Innovation Fund is disbursed in different components: Innovation Capacity Development, Concept Validation, and Emerging Projects.

Innovation Capacity Development funding's primary purpose is to increase the province's capacity to do applied research by leveraging contributions from other funding sources.

MAXIMUM FUNDING: \$500,000

Concept Validation funding is primarily for demonstrating and strengthening the business case of a research project. For example: prototyping, bench testing, clinical trials, and pilot projects.

MAXIMUM FUNDING: \$500,000

Emerging Project funding is earmarked for early stage research that has the potential to become an innovation. Funding can be used to assist in the preparation of major funding proposals, business cases, securing IP, or infrastructure.

MAXIMUM FUNDING: \$25,000

Dr. Mohsen Mohammadi was recruited in 2015 by the University of New Brunswick. He has recently announced plans for a new Marine Additive Manufacturing Centre of Excellence with secured private industry funding, as well as more than \$450,000 in contributions from NBIF.

Lyme disease in Canada is often misdiagnosed and undertreated due to a lack of understanding of the disease. **Dr. Vett Lloyd** and her team at Mount Allison University are hoping to change that, and are working diligently in the lab researching the Borrelia-infested ticks that cause Lyme disease.
